Minutes of the Regular Vestry Meeting of the Rector, Wardens & Vestry of Caroline Church of Brookhaven, Setauket, N.Y. held January 21, 1993

The meeting was opened by the Rector with prayer at 8:10 p.m. The minutes of the December 1992 Vestry meeting were distributed and read. After a brief discussion and minor changes, and upon a motion by Mr. Irving, and seconded by Mrs. Pollert, the minutes of the December meeting were accepted as read.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector presented and reviewed his calendar for the month of December, 1992 highlighting several dates, in addition to the regular conferences, hospital visitations, and private communions noting it had been a very busy month. He made mention of the Christmas Fair, December 5 and the Evening Service of Lessons and Carols, December 6, presented by the joint choirs of Caroline Church and the St. James R.C. Church. There was the well-attended, despite the severe storm, Men and Boys Corporate Communion, and installation of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew on Dec. 11. The Breakfast was cancelled as there was no power. Lastly, he was pleased to note there were 650 in attendance at the Christmas Services. Upon a motion made by Mr. Calone and seconded by Mrs. Pollert, the Rector's Report for December, 1992, was accepted as presented.

TREASURER'S REPORT
In the absence of Mr. Love, Mr. Melvin gave a brief report.
He noted that all securities are listed at book value, gain or loss not listed. He further noted we are a little
ahead in pledges for year-end, December, but fell 20% short
on investment dividends from Merrill Lynch. Everything else
is pretty much on line. After discussion, Mrs. Gilmore made
a motion, seconded by Mr. LaRosa, to accept the Treasurer's
Report for December, 1992.

FINANCE COMMITTEE No Report

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE No Report

STEWARDSHIP
In the absence of Mr. Russell, the Rector sreported we are finishing out the year with 280 pledges - \$160,020, averaging out to \$11.00 per pledge. There were 55 increases, 20 decreases and 18 new families indicating their support.

BUILDING COMMITTEE Mr. LaRosa ddddgave the Building Commitee report for December, 1992, noting the painting of the Church was completed and the carpeting has been installed. There was some question as to whether all the prayer book racks were put back in their proper places. This will be looked into. The total cost for the project was \$12,550. Mr. LaRosa asked for and received Vestry approval to cover the cost of this work. Mr. LaRosa then referred to the estimate given by Mr. Jenkins for the projected undercroft renovation, noting 1/3 of the estimate could be eliminated by using the existing bathroom and classroom doors. Everything else was fair and reasonable. Mr. LaRosa and Mr. Elling then spoke in detail of other aspects of the renovation that they would oversee themselves. After discussion a motion was made by Mr. Irving that the proposed project for the improvement of the Undercroft of the Church, estimated at \$13,600, and an additional \$10,000 budget for kitchen cabinets, electrical fixtures, plumbing, sub-contracted directly under the supervision of Mr. Elling, be approved by the Vestry. The motion was seconded by Mr. Melvin and the Vestry concurred. The work will begin in February.

CHURCHYARD, GROUNDS AND VILLAGE GREEN
Mr. Elling reported that Dr. Schadler is still at work on
the landscape design project and will meet with him in
February to outline and discuss several proposals. She has
reaffirmed the need to replace several trees; sections of
fencing in the rear churchyard are down -- these will be
incorporated in the general planning. At Mr. Elling's
request, she will also have some recommendations for accent
lighting to further enhance the outside lighting of the
church.

MUSIC COMMITTEE

In the absence of Mr. Benzinger, the Rector informed the Vestry of the results of the visits by Mr. Michael Foley and Mr. John Perigola; both came to appraise and give their recommendations for renovation of the organ. Mr. Foley's estimate was \$400,000 - \$500,000. Mr. Perigola's was considerably less and he will be in contact with Mr. Benzinger. Both men agree, however, that it is better to consider replacing the organ than to put more money into constant repairs. The Rector was more favorably impressed with Mr. Perigola. They discussed plans for the installation of a new organ, which the Rector shared with the Vestry, noting this is just a beginning, we will be hearing more about this -- perhaps this can be a memorial of some kind.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND YOUTH

Mr. Mis presented Mrs. Massie's monthly report, highlighting the following:

Attendance has been down around the holidays, however, the Christmas pageant was very well attended, as were the service December 27 (the 12 Days of Christmas) and the newly initiated Epiphany eve service, January 6, with an attendance of 40 people. There was a fine response to the Mitten tree this year. Looking ahead, Mrs. Massie has purchased daily devotion booklets to distribute to the Congregation.

The theme for the Church School for Lent will be the

various types of crosses and their meanings.

This year the receiving of Communion will be separated from the Sacrament of Confirmation and Mrs. Massie plans to take some extra time to explain these changes to the families involved.

PUBLICITY No Report

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Mr. LaRosa presented the Vestry with a further restructuring plan for the counting teams. He has suggested involving former Vestrymen as counters, making it possible to move from 6 teams to 10 teams, thereby counting every 10 weeks. Each team will consist of one Vestryman and one former Vestryman, each one being responsible for their own schedules. Former Vestrymen have been contacted and are pleased to be involved. The idea was well received. The Rector asked for and received Vestry approval.

NEW BUSINESS

The Rector informed the Vestry that Mr. William Minuse, long-time parishioner, has expressed his strong displeasure over the relocation of the commemorative plaques from within the Church proper to the balcony stairwell. This was done during the interior painting of the Church. After discussion it was agreed that Mr. LaRosa and Mr. Irving meet with Mr. Minuse prior to the Annual Parish Meeting to exchange points of view. The Rector concluded the evening by noting he and Mrs. Wancura will leave for their winter sojourn in the sun, January 28, returning February 18.

There being no further business to come before the Vestry and upon a motion made by Mr. Irving and seconded by Mr. Calone, the January meeting was adjourned at 10:10 p.m. Inext Vestry meeting will be February 23 at 8 p.m.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the parish of Caroline Church of Brookhaven, Setauket, N.Y. held on January 27, 1993

The meeting was brought to order and opened with a prayer by the Rector at 8:03 p.m. The Rector asked that the Clerk read the minutes of the previous Annual Meeting held on January 29, 1992. After some minor corrections and upon a motion by Mr. Michael Stallone and seconded by Mr. Albert Meyer the minutes were approved as corrected.

The Rector then asked Mr. David Elling a member of the Nominating Committee to present the slate of candidates for the positions of Churchwarden and Vestrymen. Mr. Elling stated that the Committee was nominating Mr. Robert Benzinger for the position of Churchwarden. The Rector then asked for any nominations for this position from the floor. There being none, and upon a motion made by Mr. Albert Meyer and seconded by Mrs. Donald E. Weinert the nominations for the position of Churchwarden was approved closed. Mr. Elling stated that the Nominating Committee was presenting Mr. Gary Mis, an incumbent, Mr. Albert Brayson and Mr. Charles Rampone for a three year term as Vestrymen. The Rector then asked for nominations from the floor; there being none and upon a motion by Mr. Jon Seymour and seconded by Mr. Arthur Gilmore the nominations were closed for the positions of Vestrymen. The polls were declared open for voting at 8:25 p.m. and to be closed at 9:25 p.m. Ballots were distributed and the Rector then appointed Mrs. Edward Kemp and Mr. Albert Meyer as counters. He further stated that we were changing the usual format of oral organizational reports and that all reports of activities and finances of each organization were in the agenda program.

At this time the Rector presented his Annual Report for 1992. He began by thanking his wife, Helena, for her support and assistance during the year the Churchwardens and Vestry for all the time they have given during the year; the parish staff; Fr. Jim Spata for his assistance with the services, Mrs. Joan Neuls and Mrs. Shirley Miskimin for their help in administration, Mrs. Beverly Simmons, Linda Sandberg and Edith Auner for their services with the music ministry and Mrs. Lorraine Massie, Church School Superintendent for her work in our Christian Education department. He further thanked all parish organizations for the time, talent and financial assistance they have given to the parish in the past year. One organization that is not mentioned in the bulletins each week is the Acolyte Guild that he is the director of. He mentioned that the Women's Fellowship Circle has been started this year with Mrs. Wylie Louison as coordinator and that Jon and Charlene Seymour are the coordinators of a new 7th and 8th grade Y.P.F. He spoke of some of the highlights of 1992 - The Feast of the Dedication and the celebration of the completion of the work by Mr. William B. Minuse to put Caroline Church on the National Register of Historical Places; Our Lenten studies programs; the 25th Anniversary celebration of The Ministries; Confirmation and the Church Fair as well as the presentation of the God and Country

awards for those scouts who had earned them in a program coordinated by the Brotherhood of St. Andrew and Fr. Jim; the Consultation on Church Union - a study program to join Christian churches together; 100th Anniversary of the Emma S. Clark library and the storm of no name that took Long Island by surprise and knocked out our power affecting two funerals, a wedding and the Men's and Boy's Breakfast which had to be postponed. The Rector mentioned he is the Dean of the North Suffolk Deanery and does nursing home services each month. He noted the the Family Consultation Service office that we sponsor is thriving, and is used both by parishioners and outsiders.

He then read a letter from Bishop Walker about the Sacred act of Confirmation. Bishop Walker stated that according to the Canons of the Church you become a full member of the church upon Baptism and should receive communion from that time and that Confirmation is a reaffirmation of those vows and should be an adult decision made at 16 years of age or older. Regional Confirmations with several church combining their confirmands would also be enacted. The Rector mentioned that through the years Confirmation has been at various ages and is considered a "Rite of Passage" and while we currently confirm at age 12 we would pressay go to age 16 and open communion to younger children. Our fifth and six grade will receive communion for the first time on Maundy Thursday. Mr. William Hall asked how the Canon handles younger children who have come from other parishes and want to receive communion. The Canon said that anyone desirous of communion may come to the Altar rail. Mrs. Charlene Seymour mentioned her concern that with such a late Confirmation age we may lose some of our teens before they are Confirmed.

The Rector then read a second letter from Bishop Walker re the Calling of a Rector. The Bishop wants all Vestries that are looking for a Rector to submit to him all candidates they are considering for that position for review. The Rector mentioned that most parishes don't realize that is the responsibility of the Senior Warden and a search committee to find a new rector and not that of the Bishop. The Bishop may submit names for their consideration and if the Bishop is not happy with their decision he may ask them to wait for 30 days, but under no circumstance according to the Canon law does he have a veto power on what Rector the church selects. The Rector is elected by the Churchwardens and Vestry of the church. Mr. Robertson Hatch mentioned that a church in Riverhead is now having problems with the Bishop re their selection of a Rector. The Rector then mentioned that if the church has not found a new Rector within a year the Bishop may appoint an interim Rector for them. A general discussion was held regarding this letter.

The Rector mentioned that the following would be our delegates at the convention in November: Mr. Robert Benzinger, Mr. David Elling and Mr. Robertson Hatch with Mr. Lenard Calone, Mr. John Love and Mr. Gordon Melvin as alternates.

At this time the Rector adjourned the meeting. The meeting was convened at 9:25 p.m. at which time the polls were closed.

Our Treasurer, Mr. John Love reviewed the 1993 church budget on a line by line bases. He mentioned that \$10,000 had been allocated for the painting of the outside of the church and that the church organ needed to be replaced and a special fund drive would probably be needed for that project. He stated that the church is in good financial shape but expressed his concern regarding the fact that the pledges do not cover the expenses of the church and we have to use the income from our investments. Mr. A. Marshall Irving asked if we were using any capital and Mr. Love said it was marginal if we were at this time.

Mr. David Elling, Chairman of the Churchyard and Ground Committee gave a report on the condition of our grounds. He stated that an aboreal survey had been done and that most of our large trees were either diseased or dying and that in 7-10 years most of them will be gone. A plan will be implemented in the spring to replace trees and bushes, enhance the church outdoor lighting and put in a children's playground in the back of the barn. The Women's Fellowship Circle will pay for the playground equipment. Mr. Elling mentioned that these items will be paid for from the churchyard endowment fund interest income. Mr. Matthew Smith asked if vandalism has dropped off since we have been using peace security system to check on the grounds each night. Mr. Elling replied that while there were still some isolated acts of vandalism there has been far less problems since we have had the security system in place. Mr. Edward Kemp asked if we were going to replace the fence is front of the Marco Smith Building and was told that bushes were going to be planted instead on Dyke Road. Mr. John Leibold brought up his concern about the traffic flow problem and Mr. Jon Seymour about the drainage in the parking lot.

In the absence of the Chairman, Mr. Elling also gave the report on the buildings. The church interior was painted, the carpeting in the church was replaced, the air-conditioning was improved, a new furnace was installed (with many thanks to Mr. Elling for installing it), classrooms in the undercroft have been refurbished so that they may be used as a library, and new lighting was installed over the prayer desk. In February the coffee room and kitchen in the parish house will be renovated with new walls, ceilings, closets, kitchen and bathrooms. Mr. Reginald Burton asked what material had been decided for the flooring and Mr. Elling replied that it had not been decided yet, but probably would be sheet linoleum.

Mr. Matthew Smith brought up the problem of the choir not being able to see the organist for direction. He felt some system should be found. Mr. Elling said that the vestry was against a mirror but was looking into the problem.

Mr. William Hall brought up the matter that the plaques that had been in the church were not replaced in their original positions. Mr. Elling stated that many churches as they renovated were removing plaques so that the churches would be more in keeping with the original colonial decor. The plaques were placed in the stairway and the small anteroom of the balcony. Mrs. Thelma Hall stated that she liked the church with the plaques in the new position. Mr. Barbara Tyler brought up the matter of the placement of Queen Caroline's portrait.

Mr. William B. Minuse stated that he thought it was an affront to those the plaques honored, that they had been removed from the church proper. He read a brief history of each person the plaques honored; Dr. & Mrs. Edward Larocque Tinker, The

Honorable Julius Attwood, The Rev. Frederick Noll, former Rector of Caroline Church, The Rev. Dan Marvin, former Rector of Caroline Church, and what achievements they had accomplished for the parish. He stated that he wished it to be so noted in the minutes that he felt the plaques should be replaced in their original positions with the wooden backing in the church proper and not on the wall of the steps to the balcony.

Mr. Matthew Smith thanked the Vestry for keeping the church in such excellent shape.

The Rector them mentioned that \$62,994 had been given to the Diocese and charitable concerns this year through our operating budget and organization gifts.

The Rector then asked for a count of the balloting by Mr. Albert Meyer. He noted that 51 people had voted with 50 votes for Mr. Robert Benzinger for Warden, 47 for Albert Brayson for Vestryman, 51 for Gary Mis for Vestryman, 50 for Mr. Charles Rampone for Vestryman and several write in votes. The Rector then thanked the outgoing vestrymen; Mrs. Beverly Gilmore, clerk and Mr. A. Marshall Irving for their service to the church.

Old Business - None.

There being no new business the meeting was adjourned at 10:34 p.m. on a motion by Mrs. Peggy Eichacker and seconded by Mrs. Beverly Gilmore.

The \$37,000 would then be paid out of the Building Fund. After discussion, Mr. Benzinger moved that the General Fund loan the Building Fund \$37,000 to pay for painting the church and renovating the Parish House basement. Mr. Mis seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS

Before further business transpired, the Rector asked the Vestrymen to fill the internal officer positions on the Vestry, namely the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Clerk and Assistant Clerk. After discussion, Mr. Benzinger moved that we accept Mr. Love as Treasurer, Mr. Melvin as Assistant Treasurer, Mr. Calone as Clerk and Mrs. Pollert as Assistant Clerk. Mr. Love seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

The Rector reported that there are 283 pledges for a total of \$160,000. currently. Mr. Brayson said he will be attending a three day meeting on Planned Giving in New York City beginning on April 22.

BUILDING COMMITTEE

Mr. Elling reported that Mr. Dean Jenkins has begun the remodeling of the Parish House basement. Mr. Jenkins has gutted the coffee room/kitchen/bathrooms and is installing 5/8" drywall in the area. An electrician will strip the old wiring from the area, replace it and install a new circuit breaker panel bringing the wiring up to public assembly code. The floor covering for the area was discussed in detail. Because of the many needs and constraints of the rooms, further input from suppliers was requested. Placing different heating zones in the Parish House was discussed also, but left open. Mr. Elling concluded by informing us that a new thermostat had been installed in the church.

CHURCHYARD, GROUNDS AND VILLAGE GREEN

The Rector read a letter he had received from Trellis Jaeger's son releasing two family grave sites and requesting the grave stone for his parents be moved to reflect their burial positions. It was decided that a proper footing under the grave stone should be installed when the stone was recentered.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND YOUTH

Mrs. Massie submitted a report noting that the winter flu season was taking its toll on our otherwise robust program. A special program was planned for President's Weekend due to anticipated low attendance. Many plans for the Lenten season were underway such as children's programs at the Lenten dinners. Discussion of the separation of first Communion and Confirmation was scheduled with the parents for February 28.

PUBLICITY

It was suggested that we try to receive publicity for the Episcopal Church Women's food drive for the Ministries at Coram.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Mr. Minuse's impassioned plea for a return of the plaques made at the Annual Meeting was discussed. The concensus of the Vestry was that they would remain in their new locations. The Rector reminded the Vestry that final decision for the Vestments and Church rested in his hands. Mrs. Pollert suggested that a brochure on Caroline Church might reflect the highlights of the historical information Mr. Minuse presented. Mr. Meyer had given her a rough draft of one he had started. The Rector suggested that Mr. Jack Schultheis could be consulted as he works in the public relations field.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Benzinger presented a new plan for Counting Teams. The new proposal is for 10 teams consisting of one current Vestry member and one former Vestry member. Each team would count every 10 weeks except for Easter and Christmas when 5 teams would count together. The plan was discussed and accepted.

The Rector explained the Lenten dinner program on Spirituality and dates.

There being no further business to come before the Vestry, the meeting adjourned at 10:00 pm. The next Vestry meeting will be at 8:00 pm on Wednesday, March 24, 1993.

Minutes of the Regular Vestry Meeting held, April 21, 1993

Present:

The meeting was opened by the Rector with prayer at 8:15PM. minutes of the March 24, 1993 meeting were presented and accepted as corrected.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities of March; see attachment. Mr Love moved that the report be accepted, Mr. benzinger seconded it, and the motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Income: Income is behind the budget by over \$14K, primarily due to dividends and legacies. Pledging is ahead of budget, but behind 1992 giving. The Easter plate collection was, although \$3200, \$600 less than last year.

Expense: Expenses are close to target including Ed's Floor Cleaning Service which was questioned last month (two invoices paid in Feb., The \$24.6K over expenditure has in March). predominantly with the work being done in the Parish House which was not budgeted. Mr Love indicated the Church cannot continue to spend money without a plan to increase income sources or to have addition investment income.

Investments: There has been a reduction in investment income from last year (\$45K less) due to the economy and low interest rates. The investment income cannot sustain the current spending.

Mr Benzinger will discuss the speed at which investment activities

can be accomplished under New Business.

Liability: Liabilities are up \$8K from last year.

Building Fund: A discussion was held on whether to sell the 46 shares of AIG, close the Merrill Lynch account, and save \$100 annual service charge or take other actions to save money. It was recommended that the Treasurer speak with the brokerage firm to see if it would waive the charge since we have other accounts with them. In addition it was decided to sell the stock anyway at this time and put the proceeds into the Building Fund.

It was noted that \$972 was spent for new chairs for the coffee room.

<u>Church Yard Fund:</u> The fund made \$4K, and spent \$4.6K. Remembrance Fund: The remembrance fund grew by \$375.

The Treasurer reiterated that we seem to be spending more than we take in; we need a plan to get monies for future expenditures; we are not generating excess funds on 5% interest accounts; and a new organ would have to be included in a broader, memorial type drive.

FINANCE REPORT:

No Report.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

Committee was unable to meet before the vestry meeting. A meeting will be scheduled prior to the next vestry meeting. No immediate actions are required in the near future.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE:

No report. However, the concerns articulated by the Treasurer and the Vestry will be addressed in the plan which will be submitted at the June vestry meeting.

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

Mr Elling reported that the outside wall by the kitchen was damaged in the wind storm and will be repaired. The air conditioner for the nursery has not been purchased yet, but will be in the near future. The coffee room is coming along well and should be ready for use in two weeks. Following that, other room/areas in the Parish House will be cleaned up.

CHURCH, GROUNDS, & VILLAGE GREEN:

Mr Elling reported that minor vandalism occurred on the shed, but that he had already repaired the damage. The landscape architecture drawing and plan have been received, and a meeting will be set up for the committee, and other vestry members, to view and comment on it. Mrs Pollert recommended removal of the tree stump by the barn to increase parking capacity and to eliminate a hazard. Mr Elling will look into grinding down the stump and paving over it. The area just behind the barn will be cleaned up and fenced in to provide a location for playground equipment which the Ladies Fellowship plans on donating to the Church.

MUSIC, ORGAN, & PIANO:

The committee is continuing its study on a recommendation to repair/replace the church organ.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Mr Mis read Mrs Massie's monthly report. The key points are: attendance is now averaging 100 per Sunday; confirmation classes have begun with sixteen students; on Maunday Thursday the fifth and sixth graders received Communion with their families for the first time; over \$110 have been collected thus far in mite boxes for the Heifer Project International; and the Resurrection Tree was decorated. One need of the church school is to include room partitions for the basement; no action was taken at this time.

PUBLICITY:

No Report.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

There was a discussion on insurance and the need for an umbrella policy. It was agreed to purchase a \$1 million umbrella policy. There was also a discussion on insurance coverage for sexual harassment. Under the present liability coverage there is a limit of \$10K; the umbrella policy does not provide any additional coverage. There is some activity at the diocesan level about procuring this type of insurance. Mr Russell will be looking into this.

NEW BUSINESS:

There was a discussion on reaction time required to respond to stock market activities. Mr Benzinger wanted to know the Vestry's position on giving the Investment Committee more latitude on buying/selling stocks, or whether the process should remain as is, with Vestry approval needed for each activity. Conclusion was to continue to bring committee recommendations to the Vestry for approval of 3/4 of the Vestry.

A suggestion was made and agreed with, for the Vestry to review and discuss the current By-Laws. A copy of the By-Laws will be provided to each member; a discussion date will be determined at a later time.

There is a concern about consistency in the counting procedure being use. To address the concern, Mr Benzinger will develop a standard procedure.

The Canon announced that a new "evening branch" of ECW will be established. The primary women involved with this new branch and working on its setup are Lorrie Lockerby, Beverly Gilmore, and Bunny Russell.

The meeting was opened by the Rector with prayer at 8:05PM. The minutes of the April 21, 1993 meeting were presented and accepted as corrected.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities of April; see attachment. Of special note, Linda Sandberg worked hard on getting the Junior Choir ready for the Ascension Day evening service and concert. Mr Melvin moved that the report be accepted, Mrs Pollert seconded it, and the motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

April was not a bad month. Year to date pledges are slightly ahead of budget but behind last year. Easter giving was approximately 15% behind last year.

<u>Income:</u> Total income is slightly behind last year; interest rates continue to drop.

Expense: Expenses were \$500 more than was taken in; generally close to the budget. Pension and insurance premiums will be paid in May. The "major repairs to church" (\$15,456.75) will be charged to the Building Fund so that the actual difference between year to date cash receipts to disbursements is -\$9707.16. Investments: On investment value, we always take the most conservative position. If our total portfolio had produced \$5000 more interest per year during these four (flat) years, we would be in much better shape financially. Mr Brayson moved that the report be accepted, Mr Melvin seconded it, and the motion carried.

FINANCE REPORT:

No Report.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

Committee was unable to meet before the vestry meeting. A meeting will be scheduled prior to the next vestry meeting if needed.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE:

The Stewardship Committee met this month to discuss future fund raising. Mr Brayson outlined some of the committee's ideas:

- * need a 3 fold/way approach
 - annual giving
 - capital fund
 - planned giving
- * parish community is unaware that we are spending more than we are getting in; need a readable statement with each quarterly report of pledge status
- * need a quarterly statement from the floor (during services) on budget/stewardship status
- * increase the number of stewardship sermons
- * create some appropriate brochures
 - new orientation/get reacquainted with the Church and what it offers
 - stewardship brochure explaining operating costs, memorial fund, building fund, opportunities for giving, etc
- * need to get new people connected to the Church when they visit provide information on parish mission, stewardship, future, etc
- * have weekly bulletins or newsletter dealing specifically on stewardship; possibly discuss at other Church events
- * must raise annual giving by 30%
- * need a concerted effort by the Vestry; need a paradigm shift

The Rector gave the Vestry an historical perspective on giving at Caroline Church. There was a general discussion on the issues raised. The Vestry was in general support of the committee's ideas and vision, however, time was running out to get everything lined up for the upcoming pledge drive. The committee will meet in the very near future to map out a plan which will be presented at the next Vestry meeting in June.

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

Mr Elling reported that the air conditioner for the nursery has not been purchased yet, but will be in the near future. The coffee room is completed and many positive comments were received. A circuit breaker and fluorescent lighting fixture were repaired. The Vestry noted and acknowledged Mr Elling's personal support and dedication to this project. Other rooms/areas in the Parish House will be cleaned up next.

Mr Elling recommended that the church building not be painted at this time since first, we do not have sufficient funds to do the job, but secondly, we know that once we start this project, we will uncover other areas in which major repairs will be needed.

CHURCH, GROUNDS, & VILLAGE GREEN:

Mr Elling reported that a proposal for a playground has been received by the Women's Fellowship for \$12,000. They are prepared to donate \$1000 toward the purchase of the playground. The Vestry, after a long discussion on the pros and cons of such a purchase, voted to use investment income from the "church yard fund" to cover the cost of this playground. This will not effect, or take monies from, the operating fund

MUSIC, ORGAN, & PIANO:

The committee is continuing its study on a recommendation to repair/replace the church organ.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Mr Mis read Mrs Massie's monthly report. The key points are: over \$141 have been collected thus far in mite boxes for the Heifer Project International; special banners have been reserved from the Parish Resource Center for Confirmation; new curriculum is being reviewed for next years Sunday School.

PUBLICITY:

Work on new brochures will begin in the near future. The Theophilis Mission information will be sent to the Village Times.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

None.

NEW BUSINESS:

A luncheon will be held for the Bishop following Confirmation on Sunday, June 6,1993. The Vestry is invited to attend.

The meeting was opened by the Rector with prayer at 8:10 p.m. The minutes of the May 1993 Vestry meeting were read and approved.

HE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities for May. We were fortunate to have the Rev. Norman Elliott, from Alaska, as a guest preacher, May 2. Mr. LaRosa moved to accept the Rector's Report. Mr. Rampone seconded the motion and the motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. Love presented the current financial condition. Income: Pledging, which has plateaued, is at the same level as last year. Collection income is ahead of budgeted levels; Investments below. Expenses: Expenses are close to the budgeted level and less than the income for the month (primarily due to the 5th Sunday in May). Yearly expenditures, however, are \$20,000 ahead of income. \$15,000 of that amount is the Parish House basement (Coffee Room) renovations which will be charged to the Building Fund. Mr. Love warned that overall spending is surpassing income.

Vision for Caring: Approximately \$1,000 per month is being received for Vision for Caring which matches the pledged amount. Mr. Brayson moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, Mr. Rampone seconded and the Report was accepted.

Mr. Love requested the auditor's to review the Churchyard Fund expenditures. The Churchyard Fund can only be used for the maintenance and security of the churchyard. While the Peace Security expenses are appropriate, paying for the rayground equipment would not be in their judgement. Mr. Rosa asked that a copy of the Churchyard Fund document be available for review. Mr. Love suggested, Mr. Brayson moved and Mr. Elling seconded that the \$12,000 for the playground equipment be taken from the income of the Remembrance Fund. The motion carried. Mrs. Pollert again questioned the location selected for safety reasons. There was no further discussion.

FINANCE COMMITTEE No Report

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE No Report

STEWARDSHIP

The Committee met several times this month to devise a plan to augment annual giving, Mr. Brayson reported that the first phase would be to mail a letter to all parishioners alerting them to the Budgetary situation and ask for additional participants on the committee. A draft of the letter was presented for review and approval. A letter would also go out to all the committees/ organizations requesting them to send representation to the Stewardship Committee. The Committee also suggests a quarterly pledge report and an operating budget graphic display by percentages for the congregation. A sample was shown for discussion. A recommendation was made to the Finance Committee to establish a Hospitality Fund Category which ruld avoid some current ambiguities from commingling of ands in other categories.

BUILDING COMMITTEE

Mr. Elling reported: 1) the baby-sitting area needed an air conditioner. 2) The church basement dehumidifier, though noisy, could no longer be placed in the closet as it had to be 10 inches from the wall. 3) the central air conditioning was serviced June 18, and 4) the roofer fixed the loose shingles and the vinyl siding on the north side of the Marco C. Smith Bldg. Vandalism of the shed continues to be a problem despite Peace Security. Peace Security will be contacted about the number and times of their stops and asked to be more thorough. Mr. LaRosa suggested that the parking lot be secured with posts and chain. Discussion followed. The consensus was to see if Peace Security tighter surveillance would resolve the problem before other measures were taken. Mr. Rampone suggested the other churches in the area be contacted to see if pooling resources could provide better security coverage.

CHURCHYARD, GROUNDS AND VILLAGE GREEN
The Rector suggested that the two post lamps still using regular bulbs be rewired to accept long lasting high intensity bulbs. Mr. Elling reported the landscape plan should be ready the beginning of July. The fence on the north side of the Churchyard has fallen apart and needs to be replaced. The new fence estimate of \$2,000 would include auge galvanized fence posts with wooden stockade fencing for the North side and the playground. As the fence installer did not want to clear the area, Michael Vitale will be hired to remove the fence and clear the ivy from a

three foot wide section, the length of the fence for \$250. These proposals were unanimously supported. Mr. Tim Smith will pull the ivy and level the playground area. Mr. Elling discussed the recurrent water problem in the Parish House basement. He proposed to solve the water intrusion problem by: 1) bricking up the remaining basement windows, 2) replacing the sidewalk from the Parish House to the Sacristy with one tipped away from the buildings and 3) installing 6 inch PVC piping to drain water into the parking lot sewer. The bid for the work was \$21,000. Mr. Love requested that the amount be broken into building and churchyard parts. Mr. LaRosa moved we have the work done splitting the total amount of \$21,000 between the Churchyard Fund and the Operating budget. Mr. Rampone seconded the motion and it carried.

Two interments had taken place: Dr. J.B. Kuper, Plot 79A, Northerly Section 1, 1st level., and Mrs. Jenny Mazza, Northerly Section 2, Plot 112A, Top level.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AND YOUTH

Mr. Mis summarized Mrs. Massie's report, 19 were confirmed on June 6 and 108 attended the closing of Church School, June 13. Coffee Hour honored the graduates that day.. Staffing is needed for Grades 1 and 6. New curriculum is being evaluated. Mrs. Massie suggested moving the Fair to May. The YPF had a busy year's end with a weekend at Camp De Wolfe, and trips to the Cloisters and Adventureland. The Rampones were thanked for donating the buses to Adventureland. The Seymours, Strickleys, Christensens and Millers will be thanked for their advisory work.

PUBLICITY No Report

OLD BUSINESS None

NEW BUSINESS

Rector opened a discussion of building use because of a request to use the Marco C. Smith Building. Saturdays from 9 - 1 through July & August by Paulyn Church. After discussion, the request was denied because of insurance complications. The Fair was discussed. Whether to move the date or redirect the type of activity was left undecided pending further consideration.

The Three Village Historical Society requested the use of the Village Green, Saturday, July 16 for the Setauket Spies Bicycle Tour from 10 a.m. - 1 p.m. and Sunday August 1, 1993 from 3 - 7 p.m. for a family picnic with no admission, but nominal purchases of food. The July 10th request was approved, but there were questions about the restrictions for Green use on Sundays.

Mr. Elling was going to check the Green usage restrictions about the Sunday date and then notify the Historical Society.

The Clerk would send written confirmation as a follow up. There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10 p.m. The next meeting of the Vestry will be Thurs. July 22, 1993 at 8 p.m.

The meeting was opened by the Rector with prayer at 8:10PM. The minutes of the May 13, 1993 meeting were presented and accepted as corrected.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities of June; see attachment. Bishop Walker will be at Caroline Church on June 5,1994, for a bishop's visitation and confirmation.

Mrs Pollert moved that the report be accepted, Mr Love seconded it, and the motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer noted that, thus far this year, \$30k more has been spent than income received. It is important to have parishioners meet expenditures through their pledges.

The Building Fund owes \$370k to the General Fund, a decrease in \$26.06k.

The Church Yard Fund has grown \$7k since January 1, 1993. The Remembrance Fund " " \$3k; \$10.6k from the Remembrance Fund will be used toward the new playground. The fund principle is "restricted use" for memorials only; use of income from the principles is unrestricted.

The Treasurer reviewed the audit of the "Statement of Assets and Liabilities" for 1992 with the Vestry.

Mr Benzinger moved to accept the Treasurer's report, Mr Elling seconded it, and the report was accepted.

FINANCE REPORT:

No Report.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

No Report. A meeting of the Investment Committee will be scheduled prior to the next vestry meeting in September.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE:

A letter on this year's budget status and stewardship was sent to all parish families. A letter was also sent to each church organization to request a representative to seat on the Stewardship Committee.

A quarterly pledge report, with graphs depicting the budget status situation/status is ready to be issued. The next letter will address parishioner questions that have arisen since the budget/stewardship material was issued. Brochures are also being developed.

The Rector iterated how important it was to look for grants and financial aid since Caroline Church is now on the historical registry. It is anticipated that subcommittees will be established to address this and other aspects of stewardship.

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

Mr Elling reported that the air conditioner for the nursery has been installed.

The pooling of rain water around the church building, slype, and parish house has been fixed by installing a new drainage system, new footing around stairwells, and bricking close all basement window openings.

A "safety plan" for evacuating church buildings is needed. Slate in front of the church, approximately five feet out from the steps, needs to be replaced. A motion for \$2.7k from the Church Yard Fund to cover the cost of repairs was made by Mr Brayson, seconded by Mr Rampone, and passed.

CHURCH, GROUNDS, & VILLAGE GREEN:

Mr Elling reported that the new playground is approximately 90% installed. A box of miscellaneous hardware, not yet delivered, is needed to complete the installation; the material is expected within one or two weeks.

A fence is needed around the electric transformer and the air conditioning units outside the Marco C. Smith building. Mr Elling moved to augment the work scope in the yard by \$1k to cover the cost of purchasing and installing a white vinyl fence.

The motion was seconded by Mr Melvin and passed.

MUSIC, ORGAN, & PIANO:

No Report.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Mr Mis noted that there were three teacher vacancies: kindergarten, first grade, and sixth grade. These vacancies will be filled prior to the start of Sunday School in September. The egress from the new playground will be looked at to insure safety, especially with respect to the parking lot and vehicle movement.

PUBLICITY:

No Report.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

None.

NEW BUSINESS:

There was a discussion about resurrecting the Planning and Evaluation Committee to work on future plans for the parish. The Senior Warden and Rector will follow up on this.

A letter was received from the Women's Fellowship Circle, expressing "deep and heartfelt gratitude to the members of the Vestry" for their approval and support of the new playground.

The Rector noted that there was a need to clean up storage areas in the parish house, and that the barn could be used to store 'good' material under some type of cover (roof leaks in the barn will be addressed at a future time when the 1994 budget is discussed).

There was a general discussion about the possibility of a "thrift shop" at Caroline Church. There was a lot of general support for the idea, but no clear consensus on how to proceed. The discussion concluded with no recommendations or actions to be taken at this time.

There was a general discussion on the need to "table" proposals for <u>one meeting</u> to allow Vestry members the opportunity to consider and evaluate proposals more thoroughly. This discussion will be continued at the next Vestry meeting.

- a- By-Law review and discussion
- b- Safety Plan for church buildings
- c- Safe egress from new playground
- d- Discussion: "table" proposals

There being no further business to come before the Vestry, the meeting was adjourned at 10:11PM. The next Vestry meeting will be at 8:00 PM on Wednesday September 15, 1993.

The meeting was opened by the Rector with prayer at 8:10PM. The minutes of the July 22, 1993 meeting were presented and accepted.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities of July and August; see attachment. Items of importance: quite a few baptisms; the Thursday Eucharist Service at the Poor Clares Convent will no longer have to be celebrated by the Rector, the Sisters will be worshipping with the Brothers at the Friary; and acolyte training was completed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer reviewed the August financial report. Pledging payments are slightly ahead of last year, but still slightly behind the budget. Overall year-to-date, the church continues to spend more money than it receives (\$45.5k). There was a motion to accept the Treasurer's report - Elling/Benzinger/passed.

FINANCE REPORT:

The budget process for 1994 will begin in October.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

A committee meeting was held this month. Investment Committee made the following recommendations to lower the average cost

basis, of the Church's investments.

1- sell Continental CDs - capital gains: \$54k
2- sell Treasury note - capital gains: \$22k

total: \$76k

3- buy 500 shares Phillip Morris buy 500 shares Merc

buy 300 shares Pfisser total: -\$61k 4- put balance into CMA: total: \$15k

The Treasurer voiced concern that he might have to eventually take capital gains to makeup budget shortfall. The Senior Warden indicated that there were other instruments available if short fall coverage is needed. There was a motion to accept the Investment Committee recommendation - Benzinger/LaRosa/passed.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE:

There will be an every-member canvass for this years stewardship drive; every family will be contacted directly. There will be two meetings open to the parish to discuss the budget situation, the need for a new approach to stewardship, and the canvass process; in addition, these meetings will give parishioners the opportunity to ask questions and participate in the process. It is important for the Vestry to be leaders in providing financial support, as well as their talents, to the Church.

All major Church organizations have identified individuals to work with the Stewardship Committee on this drive. It was decided that the current pledging amount for each pledging unit will not be made available to the canvasser - this information will remain confidential.

There are several diocesan meetings available to clergy, vestrymen, stewardship committee members, etc., to discuss and look at strategies for a successful stewardship campaign; several Vestry/committee persons will be attending.

The overall position of the Vestry is that the operating budget should not exceed the annual giving (pledge).

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

The following clarification was agreed upon by the Vestry: The slype is a continuation of the walk around the Church, and is therefore supported by the Church Yard Fund. The roof over the slype belongs to the Church Building Fund.

A white fence was installed around the A/C and power transformer next to the Marco C. Smith Building.

Mr Elling reported that the new plan for the Church yard is ready to be implemented as needed. Mr Elling will explore the possibility of having Dr Shadler supervise the implementation of the plan, as approved by the Vestry. There was a motion to spend \$10k for tree removal, as specified in the new plan - Elling/Love/passed.

MUSIC, ORGAN, & PIANO:

No Report.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Mr Mis was not available due to the illness of his mother. The monthly report from the Superintendent of Church School was read.

PUBLICITY:

A new Church schedule was sent to the Village Times. A new Church brochure will be issued in coordination with the stewardship drive. Mr Al Meyer provided a brochure of the Church History which will be used as the basis for the new brochure. A second brochure will be developed which will outline the different areas within the Church.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Tabling issues for one meeting: after discussion, it was decided to reject this proposal. It was the Vestry's opinion that it is not possible to do this in all cases. In addition, the Vestry does not meet frequently enough to be able to delay action on many issues and still respond in a timely manner. The intention is to form committees to investigate details and to respond to questions on larger or complex proposals.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr LaRosa indicated that Peace Security is not meeting the property coverage specified in their contract with the Caroline Church. He contacted Arrow Security who indicated they would have no problem meeting the coverage specification. Mr LaRosa will followup with Arrow Security to get more details.

Mr LaRosa will look into changing out the NY Telephone Co payphone in the Marco C Smith Building with a church "owned" phone which should save the Church money.

Mrs Pollert will look into the possibility of establishing some guide lines for church building utilization by parishioners and non-parishioners alike.

Mr LaRosa emphasized the need to get people to attend the Epiphany Ball on January, 22, 1994, not only because it promotes fellowship and people will have a good time, but it will keep the cost down for everyone. The guaranty to the caterers is for 120 people in order to cover a rate of \$40 per person.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities for October; see attachment. Items of importance: Caroline Church is now an official satellite of the Consultation Family Service. It provides services to both parishioners and non-parishioners. Rampone/Brayson/passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer reviewed the September financial report. Pledging payments are slightly ahead of last year, but still behind the budget. Investment income is less than expected. The budget was over spent in September by \$5.3k. The Church Yard fund decreased by \$18.1k due to work on the slype, walkways, and foundation leaks. The Remembrance Fund went up \$6.1k. There was a motion to accept the Treasurer's report - Pollert/rampone/passed.

FINANCE REPORT:

The budget process for 1994 has begun. A meeting of the budget committee is set for next week. The committee will work on closing the deficit gap over the next few years; progress will depend on the stewardship drive. The committee is made up of Mr Love-chairperson, and Messrs. Brayson, Melvin, and Meyer.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

No Report.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE:

All Vestry members have indicated their pledge intention for 1994. Nineteen of twenty pledging units on the initial canvass increased their pledge for 1994. Several additional canvassers have volunteered. Additional pledge cards were handed out at the meeting to Vestry members to canvass. Pledge cards were mailed to those parishioners who are out of town.

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

Fire alarms were cleaned and serviced. Mr Elling dropped the smoke detectors into their proper position in the hung ceiling in the Parish House(coffee room area). An "Exit Plan" will be developed for a fire in the Church/Parish House.

Many churches have applied to the NY Landmarks Conservancy for grants. Mr Elling will contact the Conservancy to find out what it is currently interested in funding. The deadline for a Fall '94 grant is May 1, 1994.

The Rectory den area roof needs reshingling. The Rector will contact a contractor for prices.

CHURCH, GROUNDS, & VILLAGE GREEN:

Trees were fertilized. Ten trees have been identified for removal. Dr. Schiler will supervise the plan; she will meet with the committee to get its recommendations and to answer questions. THE Setauket Historical Society will be touring the cemetery this month. It will use the Carriage shed for refreshments.

MUSIC, ORGAN, & PIANO:

The organ will be tuned prior to the holidays.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Mr Mis read the Church School Superintendent's monthly report. A review of the Superintendent's work hours was performed to identify the hours needed to support a successful Christian Education program. The Superintendent requested the review because she is putting in more hour than originally envisioned by the Christian Education Committee.

Motion: The Superintendent of Christian Education shall be given a compensation adjustment in 1993 of \$500.00 for extensive work performed in 1993, and that her hours be authorized to be 20 per hours week starting in 1994. Benzinger/Pollert/passed.

PUBLICITY:

No Report. Activities continue.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Rector met with Arrow Security. It will meet our security and surveillance requirements as specified. We are looking to execute a contract with them.

Vestry Selection Committee; the Sr Warden will convene the committee to work on projected vacancies which will occur this year. The committee will be made up of two Vestry members (Messrs Elling and Russell) and two parishioners(to be determined).

Messrs Brayson, Elling and Benzinger along with the Rector, will represent Caroline Church at the Diocesan Convention in Melville this Friday and Saturday.

The meeting was opened by the Rector with prayer at 8:05PM. The minutes of the October 26, 1993 meeting were presented, revised and accepted - Brayson/Melvin.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities for October; see attachment. Items of importance: several stewardship meetings, the blessing of animals, acolyte training, etc.

The Rector also noted that Mr Bill Minuse was honored at the Three Village Historical Society for the years of work and effort he has contributed to the Society. Love/Rampone/accepted.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer reviewed the October financial report. Income for 1993 is right on target and pledging is ahead of last year. Investments, however, are not meeting expectations and expenditures continue to exceed income.

Balance sheet: \$1,029K in 1993 \$1,123K in 1992

This is an overall decrease in net worth since last year.

The ECW donated \$2K toward the painting of the exterior of the church. The gift was well appreciated by the Finance Committee.

There was a motion to accept the Treasurer's report: Benzinger/Rampone/accepted.

FINANCE REPORT:

The Finance Committee has met, and will report at the next Vestry Meeting.

A discussion was held on the Superintendent of Christian Education's salary for next year. As a result, the following proposals were accepted:

1-The motion that was passed at the October Vestry Meeting to adjust the compensation for the Superintendent of Christian Education was rescinded: Love/Melvin/passed.

2-The position of Superintendent of Christian Education will be a part-time salaried position based upon a 10 month work year: September 1 through June 30. Love/Rampone/accepted.

3-Lorraine Massie, Superintendent of Christian Education, will be paid \$6K per year effective January 1, 1994. Brayson/Rampone/passed.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

No Report. Ms Pollert asked that the Investment Committee provide information to the Vestry members on the church's stock/bond portfolio, with the possibility of an overview presentation of our investments. Mr Benzinger indicated that the Investment Committee will certainly make the information available in either/both forms.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE:

Approximately 45% of the pledging units for 1994 have been received: 75 increased, 46 unchanged, and 4 decreased. In general, everything looks very favorable for a successful stewardship drive.

Mr Brayson will give a status report to the congregation at all services on the first Sunday in December.

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

Two estimates (for approximately \$10-12K) have been received for power washing the church. At the same time, we are pursuing a grant from the Conservancy for painting the church building.

CHURCH, GROUNDS, & VILLAGE GREEN:

Dead trees are being removed. High efficiency light bulbs were installed in the ground lighting fixtures.

MUSIC, ORGAN, & PIANO:

The organ will be tuned this Saturday, 11/20/93.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION:

Mr Mis read the Church School Superintendent's monthly report. The key items were:

- -some additional students attending this month
- -possibility of splitting 1st grade (21 children) for a minimal expense of a white board and a bulletin board
- -mite box collection will be sent to a mid-west flood disaster fund
- -an Advent devotional has been purchased
- -YPF: 23 youngsters went to the skating rink, plus a group went out to Camp DeWolfe for the weekend

PUBLICITY:

No Report. Activities continue.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Reviewed open items: security item closed.

Arrow Security is in place and working well. This contract will result in reduced cost with more service.

NEW BUSINESS:

The nomination committee was revamped to avoid a conflict with incumbents whose terms were ending. The new committee will consist of Mr Brayson and Ms Pollert, along with the Sr.Warden, Mr Benzinger.

THE RECTOR'S REPORT

The Rector highlighted his activities for November; see attachment. Items of importance: the Brotherhood of St Andrew and the ECW evening branch met again on a Wednesday night-this continues to be a successful program; Caroline Church hosted the Province II Brotherhood of St Andrew semi-annual meeting on November 11, 1993; and the every member canvass meetings have gone well.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Treasurer reviewed the November financial report. Pledges are ahead of budget, and way ahead of last year. Expenses are very close to budget. For the first time in a long while, more money was received than was spent in a given month. There was a motion to accept the Treasurer's report: Brayson/Elling/accepted.

FINANCE REPORT:

The Finance Committee issued a proposed budget for 1994. A review and discussion followed. After some minor adjustments, the budget for 1994 was adopted as amended: Benzinger/LaRosa/adopted.

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE:

No Report.

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE:

Approximately 200 pledging units for 1994 have responded: 111 increased, 74 unchanged, 11 decreased and there were 4 new pledges. In general, everything looks very favorable for a successful stewardship drive; to date, there are still 60 to 80 pledges outstanding.

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

Brookhaven Locksmith inspected the fire system. A back flow device was found to be missing in the system. This device prevents anti-freeze solution from possibly getting into the water system. The new device was installed: \$440.00.

The Rector reported that there were ceiling tiles missing in the coffee room, and that water stain tiles need to be replaced. Also, he indicated that there were one or two shingles on the carriage shed which needed repair. Finally, he noted that money was needed to buy shelves for the new library; it was determined that the money for shelving had been included in the 1994 budget.

Mr Russell indicated that all insurance and appraisals were up to date.

Mr LaRosa indicates that the new phone, and needed phone line, should be installed by the end of December, or shortly thereafter.

CHURCH, GROUNDS, & VILLAGE GREEN:

- -preparation for the Church School pageant is going well; the performance is scheduled for next Sunday
